DAVID CROWDER*Band HEADS DOWN UNDER IN JANUARY 09

The leader of the Texas based David Crowder*Band promises audiences attending New Zealand's Parachute Festival next year that the band's show will be "a happy ruckus party".

The Crowder*Band is performing at the festival 23-26 January along with Casting Crowns, Kutless, and Family Force Five.

Crowder - who was in Australia last week for the Sydney passion event - says he and the band have huge expectations about playing at the festival which is the largest event of its kind in the southern hemisphere.

"Our expectations are huge, we can't wait to get there," Crowder told TRAA.

"If you're with us, it will be a happy ruckus party singing together. So come and be ready to sing with us, and we'll be happy!" David says with a grin from ear to ear.

In the lead up to the New Zealand festival, some of the key acts will perform in Sydney and Brisbane.

On Thursday 22 January, David Crowder*Band, Kutless, and Magnify will perform at Brisbane City Church.

And Casting Crowns will perform at the Hillsong Church in Sydney on 22 January, and Brisbane's Gateway Centre on 23 January.

David Crowder is a special guest on *The Reality Zone*® next week. The youth show, hosted by Don and Moondog, is heard on more than 100 radio stations throughout Australia, New Zealand, and the rest of the world.

DELIRIOUS? TO RELEASE ITS FINAL SINGLE

The d:boys - Delirious? - will issue what is likely to be its final single next month.

The song - *Love Will Find A Way* - from its CD *Kingdom Of Comfort* - will be issued on three discs.

Two CDs will contain different versions of the song, and a DVD will feature the music video.

In the past, Delirious? has released a number of singles that gained strong positions on the UK charts including:

- *See The Star* peaked at 16
- *It's OK* peaked at 18, and
- *Waiting For Summer* went to #26.

Delirious? will record another live album and DVD as its final project before it disbands at the end of 2009.
