

### LEGENDARY CCM ROCKERS REUNITE FOR EASTERFEST

Resurrection Band reunite next year to perform at Easterfest 2010.

The US rockers, also known as Rez Band or Rez, formed in the early 70s and was one of the most popular pioneer acts in contemporary Christian music.

Led by the husband and wife team of Glenn and Wendi Kaiser, the band played Christian rock and addressed a variety of social ills in their lyrics.

The band's popularity peaked in the 80s when Rez gained mainstream crossover success.

While the band officially disbanded some time ago, it occasionally plays one-off dates. And Easterfest is one of them.

Resurrection Band toured Australia several times in the 70s and 80s, and co-wrote several songs with local artists such as Peter Beveridge. These songs appeared on Beveridge's Myrrh LP *Static On The Frequency*. These days, Peter is the creative director of Bredon Hill Films and TV.

Rez Band joins fellow Americans Superchick, Canadians Article One, and a host of yet to be announced acts to perform at Australia's largest Easter event next year.

Easterfest is a three-day event that takes place in Toowoomba April 2-4.

### BOYLE FULFILLS DREAMS WITH STONES, MONKEES, AND HYMNS

Susan Boyle has unveiled the track listing for her debut album.

*I Dreamed A Dream* from the *Britain's Got Talent* runner-up will be released next month.

"It was my greatest ambition to release an album and I have finally achieved it," Boyle says.

"This amazing journey has helped me find my own identity and fulfill my wish. There is happiness out there for everyone who dares to dream," she adds.

The album features 11 cover versions and one new song *Who I Was Born To Be* written especially for Boyle.

Other songs include a breathtaking performance of the Rolling Stones' *Wild Horses* (also her debut single), the Monkees' *Daydream Believer* and her signature tune *I Dreamed A Dream*.

She's also recorded two hymns *How Great Thou Art*, and *Amazing Grace*, and the carol *Silent Night*.

Based on pre-release sales, the album's set to go to number one worldwide with stores ordering more copies of the CD than Whitney Houston's comeback album *I Look To You*, and The Beatles remastered collection.
